





Key Benefits

Transforming Primary Health Care through 5 Strategic Directions

- 1 Bring About Cultural Change
 - Changes in primary health care will require changes to collective behaviours, attitudes and mindsets of all Albertans and providers.
- 2 Enhance the Delivery Of Care
 The health system has resources and capacity but it is inequitably distributed. PHC needs to be better integrated and coordinated.
- Establish Building Blocks for Change

 Structural components (such as effective governance, common information management and effective evaluation) need to be enhanced or created to continue moving towards a vision towards PHC
- Health Services Design Based on Population Needs

 Communities have unique assets that influence overall health and wellbeing. These assets address unique needs and must be supported to enable opportunities to develop local solutions
- Increase Value and Return On Public Investment
 Albertans pay more for health care than other Canadians despite our young population and our system ranks in the middle of the pack on performance

Key Component: Health Home

A Health Home...

means access to a core set of primary care services delivered by a team of providers who manage and coordinate your health care journey and connect you to other health and social services.

Attachment to a Health Home

- The expression of a continuous and longitudinal relationship between individuals and their primary health care provider/team
- Benefits to Albertans include:
 - Continuity of care over time and for specific conditions
 - Improved care management
 - Improved ability to confidently and competently manage their own care
 - Proactive screening and follow-up
- Benefits to providers include:
 - Improved ability to provide continuous care management over time, leading to better health outcomes and less use of emergency/acute
 - The ability to identify a panel of patients and target services/programs
