Alcohol sales in Alberta

- Drinkers: 11% people over 15 are heavy drinkers
- Sales (ex taxes) : \$2.091 billion / \$573 per cap
- Taxes \$578 million / \$158 per capita
- Total retail: \$721 per person

FASD

- Fetal alcohol syndrome
- Fetal alcohol spectrum disorder
- Related to alcohol consumption during pregnancy

FASD epdemiology

Incidence (US) 1 case / 1,000 births
 (40,000 births in Alberta)



• **Prevalence**: 1 per cent of population (38,000 people in Alberta)

FASD effects

- Primary disabilities
 - Adaptive functioning
- Secondary disabilities
 - Adaptation to environment
- Caregiver burden

FASD costs

Childrens' costs - annual

- N=400 children
- Basic maintenance N=394 \$7,930 per
- Special needs N = 389 \$15,617 per
- Exceptional N=63 \$3,663 per
- Total: **\$23,760**




Lifetime costs per person with FASD: Alberta





<u>Annual</u> population – based costs








FASD persons in the criminal justice system

- In sample of Manitoba inmates:
 - 10% definitely had FASD
 - 19% may have had FASD
 - MacPherson (2005)
- E.g., Persons with FASD make up 1% of population / between 10% and 29% of prison population

Criminal justice costs

Each <u>charged</u> person generates

-\$16,138 in criminal justice costs



Police costs

\$7,873

Prosecution costs \$1,053

Court costs

\$3,442

Corrections

\$9,147

Alberta's FASD cross ministerial initiative









SN – persons served

- 2008/9 2010/11
- 471 adults
- 804 children and caregivers

SN budgets

- \$6.2 million (= \$1.63 per capita)
- Per person served : \$4,700

Disability costs

- Education costs of special services
- Homelessness sheltering costs
- Mental illness cost of mental health services
- Crime costs to criminal justice system
- Unemployment costs of lost jobs

Recap of annual per caps

- \$718 spent on alcohol
- \$208 of which is collected in alcohol taxes
- \$155 public FASD economic burden
- \$3.70 public spending to combat adverse effects of alcohol
