Cedar House

- Acute treatment facility
- Full range of psychiatric treatment
- Non-coercive, domestic environment
- No locked doors, seclusion or restraints
- Receives patients 24 hours a day
- Accepts involuntary patients
- 15-bed capacity
- In mixed business and residential neighborhood
- Cost = \$223/day/bed
- Average length of stay = 18 days range = 1 day to 1 year

    1 team leader
    2½ therapists
    1 office manager
    ½ psychiatrist
    1/2 cook
After hours:
    On-call psychiatrist

Population 300,000

Public mental health center with full community support system

No. of adults, at any time:

in state hospital = 10 in private psychiatric hospital units = 4-6 in Cedar House = up to 15



Balsam House

- Acute treatment facility
- Full range of psychiatric treatment
- Non-coercive domestic environment
- No locked doors, seclusion or restraints
- Receives patients 8 hours/day, 5 days/week
- Receives involuntary patients
- Resident involvement in managing environment
- 8-bed capacity
- Mixed business and residential neighborhood
- Cost = \$445/day/bed
- Average length of stay = 25 days range = 1 day to 3 months

    1 mental health worker
Every weekday:
    1 nurse
    1 team leader
    1/2 case manager
    1 therapist
    1 office manager
    1 psychiatrist
    No cook
After hours:
    On-call managers and psychiatrist
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Acute treatment residence + intensive OP treatment Clients with psychosis = 98

Outcomes at:	0-6 months (n=23)	7-24 months (n=25)
Any work, school, homemaker, retired	30%	54%
Independent living	39%	71%
In acute treatment	26%	0%
